

## Roma Modulare 2026



Organisers of Roma Modulare 2026 announce that the international synth and pro audio fair in question is to be held on September 18-19, 2026 as an unmissable two-day expo in central Rome, representing a journey into electronic music devices where creativity, passion, and experimentation meet at a unique new location - L'Opificio Italicamp itself being billed as a centre for culture and education, born out of an urban regeneration project in the Ostiense-Marconi district that is one of the most vibrant areas of the capital city - boasting 900 square metres of exhibition space swarming with leading manufacturers of synthesizers and professional audio gear keen to show their latest wares, while early bird tickets are already available for anyone wishing to attend...

Organisers of Roma Modulare 2026 are on record as collectively stating: "We live in an age where division is the norm, but making music requires unity. Today, the word 'unity' takes on a meaning that can profoundly shake and transform our roots and our habits. residence at L'Opificio Italicamp as Roma Modulare 2026 swings into action on September 18-19, 2026 are Akai Professional, Arturia, Ashun Sound Machines (ASM), Bitwig, Chase Bliss, Drift DJ, Elektron, ESI, Expressive E, Joranalogue, KORGE, MA.SK, Melbourne Instruments, Moog Music, navig8.systems, Oberheim, Sequential, SOMA Laboratory, Teenage Engineering, Waldorf Music, and Xaoc Devices, while confirmed professional audio production exhibitors encompass AEA Ribbon Mics, Augspurger Monitors, Empirical Labs, Gainlab Audio, Genelec, Karno, Ocean Way Audio, Phoenix Audio, PMC Speakers, Quagliardi Pro Audio, RME, Rupert Neve Designs, Solid State Logic, and Wolff Audio, with more from both camps ultimately setting up shop there on those days, no doubt.

And as if the prospect of 900 square metres of exhibition space swarming with leading manufacturers of synthesizers and professional audio gear keen to show their latest wares is not enticing enough in itself, workshops featuring presentations of the most important market innovations, new releases, and insights also help make Roma Modulare 2026 what it is - an opportunity to share ideas, create new relationships, have fun, and listen to great music, with modular synthesizer performances promised until midnight in the venue's gorgeous garden area. All this excitement might make attendees hungry and thirsty, though rest assured that they can taste excellent craft beers and the best local flavours from the food area open from 10.00 am to 11.30 pm. Put it this way: with Roma Modulare 2026 already shaping up to be an unmissable event in a stunning location like no other, anyone interested in attending should surely do themselves a favour by bagging a decent discount with early bird tickets available until June 30, 2026.

Early bird tickets to Roma Modulare 2026 are available until June 30, purchasable as a two-day pass - priced at €20.00 EUR - or as one-day tickets for entry either on September 18 (at 2.00 pm) or September 19 (at 10.00 am) - each priced at €13.00 EUR - directly from the website below.
